Philip was born in Linton, Indiana on May 9, 1948. Phil served his country in the Marine Corps in Vietnam and was a graduate of Indiana University. He and his wife retired to Keowee Key three and a half years ago from Washington Crossing, PA. He loved golfing (even when his wife won), boating, car racing, dogs, and music. He made a mean Bloody Mary and is famous among friends and family for his epic father-daughter dance at his daughter's wedding, merely two and a half years after his bilateral lung transplant. He was a man whose presence filled the room and his loss is felt deeply by many.

Phil was diagnosed with IPF in 2001. He received a bilateral lung transplant in July 2009 and soon was back to living a very full life and oxygen tanks were a thing of the past.
