William Allen Gambrell (Bill) passed away at the age of 89 on 9-17-2025 at Cottingham House in Seneca, South Carolina.

He was born on June, 19th 1936 in Salem, S.C. to Robert Oliver and Betty Lee Bryant Gambrell. His beloved grandmother, Maggie Crawford Bryant was also present during his early life.

He joined the Navy at the age of 18, and was stationed in San Diego, CA. There, with his first wife JoAnn (Hopkins), he raised his family. He fought in the Vietnam War from beginning to end on both land and sea. He rose in rank, and retired an E-7 Chief Petty Officer in 1975, after 22 years of devoted service.

Shortly thereafter, he moved the family back to S.C. where that marriage ended, and later met the love of his life, Edith (Bolt). They have been married for 46 years, and have had many adventures traveling to different places while he worked in construction. They lived in Satolah, Ga., and built a home there, while caretaking for folks in Highlands, N.C. There, they made lasting friendships. They also often managed a campground in Manteo, the Outer Banks of Cape Hatteras. They eventually made their home in Walhalla, S.C.

He enjoyed fishing, working on projects around the house, eating good food,

He is preceded by his parents and grandmother; brothers: Bob, Jasper, and Monroe Gambrell; his sisters, Tilda (Betsy), Grace Osteen, Truly, Lillie Mae Gambrell, and Nettie Makins; and a precious infant granddaughter: Cynthia Justus.
